#### 1900

The 20<sup>th</sup> century began with race speeds increasing dramatically at some events; some race winners were now achieving average speeds in excess of 70 kph, but matters came to a head during the Paris to Roubaix race.

# COURSE DU CATALOGUE, MELUN-RANGIS-MONTEREAU-MELUN, 17 February

The entries for this 144 km (89.5 miles) event were divided into six classes, according to the value of the vehicles; the two and three wheeled vehicles contested Class A, with a maximum value of 3,000 Francs. Mercier was the overall winner; he completed the course in 2 hours 34 minutes 49 seconds.

# COUPE DES VOITURETTES, PARIS-ROUEN-PARIS, 11 March

This 218 km (135.5 miles) event started and finished in Saint-Germain. The outgoing route ran via Equevilly, Flins, Mantes, Rosny, Bonnieres, Vernon and Gaillon, and the return route ran via Boos, Fleury sur Andelle, Econis, Saint Claire sur Epte, Magny en Vein, Puiseux, Pontoise and Conflano. Tart completed the course in 5 hour 46 minutes 5 seconds and he finished second overall. Camus was the only finisher in the class for water-cooled machines. The unnamed eighth finisher is likely to have driven a four wheeled quadricycle.

There should have been a return leg to Marseilles but the competitors refused to continue because rain was falling and the conditions were considered too dangerous; the outward journey had already been difficult on dry roads. Béconnais was declared the overall winner; he completed the course in 3 hours 23 minutes 11 seconds.

## NEW YORK, 31 March

This 26 miles (41.83 km) race ran from the Waldorf Astoria Hotel to Ardsley-on-Hudson; Scott was the only finisher on a tricycle, in ninth place overall. This is the earliest race run outside Europe featured in this book.

# COUPE DE SALON, SALON-ARLES, 3 April

This 100 km (62 miles) event was the fastest road race run to date, but it cannot have followed a direct route between the two towns. Béconnais was the overall winner; he completed the course in 1 hour 22 minutes 34.6 seconds.

## PARIS-ROUBAIX, 15 April

The third and final running of this event was held over the same 268 km (166.5 miles) course as the 1899 race; the route passed through Pontoise, Beauvais, Breteuil, Doullens and Arras. Baras's time of 3 hours 48 minutes was 1 hour 47 minutes 30 seconds faster than the time set by the previous winner; at one point he covered 30 km (18.5 miles) in 18 minutes. He took over the lead after the accident which sealed the event's fate; race leader Martin ran wide, Dorel attempted to pass him on the inside and they collided. The two tricycles flew into the crowd, and the wife of Charles Bos, the Parliamentary Deputy for the Seine region, was one of two people who broke a leg; two days later motor racing was banned in the Department of Seine-et-Oise and the Secretary to the Minister of the Interior ruled that all applications to run road races in France must be submitted to him for approval or rejection. The magazine which organised the race and the individual competitors were prosecuted and fined for criminal neglect of spectator safety. This was a race for tricycles but it ran concurrently with a bicycle race.

## MADONNA DEL PILONE HILL CLIMB, TURIN, 21 April

Biscaretti was the overall winner and the only known tricycle finisher; he completed the 5 km (3.1 miles) course in 8 minutes 36 seconds.

This was the first race run in France since the controversy created by the Paris-Roubaix race, organised by the same magazine which was facing prosecution for its organisation of that event; on this occasion the race was incident free. The race distance is given as 100 km (62 miles), the same distance as the one way event run in 1899, but this race must have been run over a more direct route; Marcellin completed the course in 1 hour 24 minutes 58.8 seconds, little more than half the time taken by the 1899 winner. This was a race for tricycles only.

Metz finished third in the overall classification, 20 minutes behind the winner. The majority of entries used two drivers but Metz appears to have completed the course by himself; his time was 7 hours 40 minutes but the race distance is unknown.

#### BORDEAUX-PERIGUEUX-BORDEAUX, 3-4 June

There were two races run over different routes; the long course measured 318 km (197.5 miles) and the short course measured 260 km (161.5 miles). The tricycles contested the short course, but it should be noted that the majority of races in the modern era are run over much shorter distances. Cormier was the overall winner of the 260 km race; he completed the course in 4 hours 26 minutes 39 seconds. This was the first French race to feature cars since the partial ban on the sport was announced in April.

Vitalis completed the course in 1 hour 41 minutes 28.6 seconds and he finished fourth overall. Bonnard rode a two wheeled machine.

### PARIS-TOULOUSE-LIMOGES-PARIS, 25-28 July

This was a three day event (the second day was a rest day), run over a total distance of 1,467 km (911.5 miles) as a supporting event to the Paris Olympics. The race started and finished in the suburb of Vincennes and the overnight checkpoints were in Toulouse and Limoges.

Teste completed the course in 23 hours 54 minutes 1 second to win the Tricycle class by more than 3 ½ hours; he finished fifth overall. Times at the lower end of the field were less than creditable; Durand was the last timed finisher in a total time of 70 hours 31 minutes 40 seconds (20.8 kph, 12.9 mph), while Vial and Demeester are simply listed as having arrived. These last three finishers must have completed the course later than the scheduled finishing date.

This was the first time permission was granted to run a race from Paris since the sport was banned in the region in April; by this time the controversy had temporarily faded away.

The highlight of the week was this 82 km (51 mile) race on a route via Francorchamps, Trois-Ponts, Salmchâteau, Fraiture barracks, Aywaille and La Reid to the finish at Spa. Baron de Crawhez completed the course in 1 hour 59 minutes 9.8 seconds to win by over 1 hour 28 minutes.
